JANUARY 2017 RECORDS

Of this month one might say "Zero to sixty in 31 days" as the temperatures were all over the place. The forms of precipitation were equally varied.

(The number of records listed for most species is the record count from eBird (plus a few others). eBird record count is the number of checklists reporting the species, not the count of birds. If 10 people go to see a single special bird, the # of records is 10. Some effort is made to eliminate duplicates (same date, location, count). There were nearly 600 eBird checklists, some include all identified species, but many list only a few birds. For most species, we list the largest group "Most". First or Last is noted only occasionally, because so few arrive or depart in January. Common birds present in expected numbers and places are not listed.)

Greater White-fronted Goose: 6/16 Stissing Pd CP, BMa (only record). CP - Surprised to see 6 at once. Smaller than Canada Geese. Overall color similar to Canadas' but had white shield around orange bill, horizontal while line on each side, black barring across belly, orange legs & feet.

Snow Goose: 3/15 BMa, SJ; 3/17 TLi; 3/17 BMa, CP, Black "grin" clearly visible on white adult and 2 immatures. All in the area of Gretna and Netherwood Rd, Pleasant Valley.

<u>Cackling Goose</u>: 1/5 Sylvan Lk CP; 1/15 Round Pd Amenia MR; 1/22 Wapp Lk KH.

Canada Goose: 128 records, avg 214 each. Most 1500/6 HVRT Coleman Stn CV; 1200/5 Sylvan Lk CP; 1000/16 Stissing Pd BMa.

Mute Swan: 43 records, avg 4 each. Most 12/12 Sylvan Lk CP, CV; 12/17 Sylvan Lk CP.

American Black Duck: 33 records, avg 5 each. Most 35/21 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd JCo; 11/28 The Fly, pond on Rte 82, Pine Plains DK.

Mallard: 118 records, avg 23 each. Most 200/1 Whaley Lk CP, HT.

FEBRUARY 2017 RECORDS

Much of February was remarkably warm with temps ranging from 8 to 76 degrees. We had 17 inches of snow for the month.

The detailed data set for February (including complete list of observers) is not available to us at this time but summary data available considers all checklists submitted. Not all observed species are mentioned here. The focus is on waterfowl, winter specialties, and a few early arrivals..

<u>Greater White-fronted Goose:</u> 4 found at Stissing Pond on the 4th by Chet Vincent. Others found 8 there later in the day. Up to 8 seen on the 5th – 8th at Bethel Cross Road by CV and DK. Both locations are in Pine Plains.

Snow Goose: 1/25 Strauss Marsh CV – only report for Feb. **Canada Goose**: Most 600 on several reports.

Wood Duck: first 2/19 Madam Brett RO; most 6/23

Vanderburgh Cove DK; 6/26 Salt Point yd LM; several other reports

American Wigeon: most 10/8 Thompson Pond FT; also 1/6 Wapp Creek PSh; 3/19 Madam Brett RO; 2/25 Tivoli North Bay AMP,BMa

Northern Pintail: 2/1 WillowBrook Farm, Millerton CV; 1/25 MR, 1/27 BMa, 2/28 BB Strever Farm Pd.

Green-winged Teal: first 4/23 Vanderburgh CP,SJ; 2/23 The Fly DK; then 4 more reports of up to 5.

Black Scoter – 3/22 Norrie Point CF - flying on the Ulster side of the Hudson River

Bufflehead: early report at Norrie and Mills SR,MR, then up to 11 from 23rd on in several locations

Common Goldeneye: 2/5 Mills MR; 2/16 Westage, Fishkill SF; 1/20 Traver Pond CV;

Hooded and Common Mergansers: well reported across the county

<u>Red-breasted Merganser</u>: 1/23 Vanderburgh Cove CP,SJ **Ruddy Duck**: 1/15, 1/24 Sylvan Lk CP; 1/23 Stissing Pond CV;4/25 Woodward Hill Rd, Pine Plains MR.

Wild Turkey: most 70/2 Hollow Rd, Salt Point BMa

<u>Common Loon</u>: 1/4 Red Wing Pond, Velie Road, Lagrange DK, AMP, JAs, MG; 1/5 Mills Norrie SP SR

Pied-billed Grebe: 1/20 Sylvan Lk CP – only report

<u>Great Cormorant</u>: 1/26 near Bannerman's Island BN (seen here also in January)

Great Blue Heron: a few reports from the SW corner of the county

Golden Eagle: 1/14 Reagan Road Millerton CV - Came from Taylor Road hillside with a Canada Goose in his talons, losing altitude and eventually dropped the Goose in the snow next to a bridge over a creek and flew off. The Goose flopped toward the creek, then flew to join the other Geese nearby. When I got out of the car and approached the creek, its tail feathers were askew but was able to fly okay. Golden nape clearly visible, dark tail and barely any white in the wrists of the wings on the eagle.

The rest of the Golden Eagle reports are from the Town of Dover, one adult and one immature, reported by many, last on the 18th in Feb. (They were still being reported in March.) **Northern Harrier**: about 20 reports of 1-2 across the county. More than usual for February.

Sharp-shinned Hawk: about 9 reports. AG listed the take at her feeder: Red-bellied Woodpecker, Mourning Dove, Tufted Titmouse.

Bald Eagle: many reports of 1-2 from all over and reports of more than 10 from several different places, along the Hudson, Towns of Dover and Pine Plains, and other places **Rough-legged Hawk**: scarce this winter. 1/8 Red Hook PS, only report.

Kildeer: arrived Feb 23, 5/23 Wassiac RR station SM plus reports from Dover and Salt Point. Good reports after. **American Woodcock**: arrived Feb 23 –reports from Towns of Lagrange and Clinton, 3 reports after.

Red-headed Woodpecker: 1/17 Valkill NHS, Hyde Park FT Yellow-bellied Sapsucker: Most 6/27 Lagrange yard CV American Kestrel: 6 reports from 5 different locations Merlin: 3 reports from Vassar Farm. 4 other reports including 1 of a Merlin catching and consuming a Snow Bunting 1/15 Dover CP.

Peregrine Falcon: 2/21 perched in the same tree, Union Vale DK photo; 1/4 flew through the crows coming to roost at Poughkeepsie and knocked one out of the sky. Group with CV. See also American Crow.

American Crow: 20000/4 coming into roost at Poughkeepsie south of Mid-Hudson Bridge, watched by group of 11 with CV. See also Peregrine Falcon.

Horned Lark: 400/5 Bethel Cross Rd, Pine Plains AMP; 300/15 Morse Hill Rd CP; 150/1 Willow Brook Farm, Millerton CV; 150/15 Separate Rd CV,AMP; 150/16 Johnny Cake Hollow Rd, Pine Plains CV; smaller flocks seen at various places, especially in the vicinity of Coleman Station. Also at O'Leary Farm, Salt Point.

<u>Tree Swallow</u>: 2/25 Strauss Marsh CV, Surprised to see them flying over the pond. Did not stay in sight long. (usual arrival – Mar 1)

Red-breasted Nuthatch: 3/1 Vassar Campus FT; 8 other singles reported, most at feeders

<u>Marsh Wren</u>: 2/19 Thompson Pond SR. We have a few winter records, but this is the first one for February.

Golden-crowned Kinglet: 1/15 Dover Plains DK; 1/28 HVRT Amenia CP; scarce for February.

<u>**Ruby-crowned Kinglet</u>: 1/17 Cruger Island Rd DG – unusual to find in February.**</u>

Hermit Thrush: 1/11 Vassar Farm FT

Cedar Waxwing: seem scarce – few large flocks – 8 reports, largest flock 29/28 Cary IES AMP

Lapland Longspur: 1/5 Bethel Cross Rd, Pine Plains AMP Chipping Sparrow: 1/1-24 Hi View Rd Wapp BAM – continuing from January.

Fox Sparrow: 1/9 yard CP; 1/18 Wingdale yd SM; 1/26 Stanford yd DK.

White-crowned Sparrow: 1/5 Haight Rd, Amenia CV; 5/14 Indian Lake Rd, Millerton CV; 3 other reports from nearby Reagan Road.

White-throated Sparrow: numbers peaked mid-month. <u>Vesper Sparrow</u>: 1/12 found in blizzard conditions along a roadside south of Millerton by Alex Kearney. Seen by CV and several others through the 25th, often associated with Horned Larks. Vesper Sparrow is quite unusual for February.

<u>Eastern Meadowlark</u>: 1/23 Stissing Mtn Rd, Pine Plains DK. Very unusual in February

Red-winged Blackbird: Most 3500/5 Mid-County Gun Club AP

<u>Rusty Blackbird</u>: 5/22 Jameson Hill Rd, Stanford AMP; 3/27 Tamarack BMa; 3/28 Cary IES AMP **Purple Finch**: 1/13 Stanford yard DK **<u>Pine Siskin</u>**: 1/12-15 Salt Point yard BMa; 3/17 Clinton yd JAI; 6 other reports.

Huge flocks of several thousand blackbirds (**European** Starling, Red-winged Blackbird, Common Grackle, Brownheaded Cowbird) were noted by DK, RM, BCA, LM in the Dover Plains area during $18^{th} - 20^{th}$.

Birds we usually find in February that were absent this year..... Canvasback, Rough-legged Hawk, American Coot, Wilson's Snipe, and Field Sparrow

MARCH 2017 RECORDS

Request to eBirders: PLEASE USE HOTSPOTS. When you enter your sightings, please look for an established eBird **hotspot** where you birded before using a location name of your own. Identifying and combining duplicate sightings when they are assigned to different names for the same location is a lot of extra work for compilers. Not to mention that **birders like you will benefit** if everyone uses hotspots, since they can study hotspot data to figure out where to go birding next!

SUMMARY STATS. There were 4,538 records (after removal of duplicate reports and eBird checklist shares). 114 species were reported (vs 107 last year).

WEATHER. Unlike last year, we endured a pretty unfriendly March, highlighted by a huge snowstorm on the 14th. The upside was a resurgence of Horned Lark and Snow Bunting sightings after the snow, along with a welcome deluge of Fox Sparrows and other appreciative birds in our yards. Some birds seemed late, but this was not a universal trend by far.

HEADLINERS. My favorite (which I missed, of course) is the breeding-plumaged LAPLAND LONGSPUR. We also had our first March records of VESPER SPARROW and GREATER YELLOWLEGS, and our second March records for LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL, and NORTHERN ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW. There was also one report each of ICELAND GULL and SANDHILL CRANE.

WATERFOWL. Once again this year, there wasn't much ice around. Winter and migrating waterfowl did not have to search for open water, so they were more scattered and less predictable than in colder years. Nonetheless, plenty of **migrating and returning ducks and geese** were found by diligent observers. Good numbers were reported for Wood Duck, American Wigeon, American Black Duck, Northern Pintail, Green-winged Teal, Ring-necked Duck, Bufflehead, Hooded Merganser, and Common Merganser, all showing up no later than the 6th. Liz Martens reported 24 Wood Ducks in her yard on the 25th, commenting "There was a line up to get into the nesting box." Less common birds in the waterfowl category included:

Snow Goose: 4 records, avg 4 each. 2/24,26 Gretna Rd Pleasant Valley CF, CP/HT; 11/26 Strauss Marsh (one blue phase) CV; 2/30 South Rd Pd, Millbrook SL.

Gadwall: 3/13 Round Pd Amenia MR.

NORTHERN SHOVELER: 4 records, avg 6 each.

REDHEAD: 1/5 Tivoli Bays SR; 1/11 Myers Corners Rd found by ESti, also seen by CP; 2/25 Emmadine Pd, H.Jct ES.

Greater Scaup: 1-4/19-21,25,30 Norrie Pt seen by CP, SJ, CF, AMP, BMa. Comment from CP/21: Swimming, diving, loafing, and occasionally preening with one Lesser Scaup.

Lesser Scaup: 6 records 1-3 each but also 50-70/27 Red Wing Beekman (3 separate visits) CP, HT, CF

LONG-TAILED DUCK: 1/29 Red Wing Beekman found by AMP, also seen by DK, BMa, CP, CF. Adult male transitioning to summer plumage.

Common Goldeneye: 9 records, avg 3 each. FIRST 8/6 Tivoli Bays South Bay CP; LAST 1/29 Sylvan Lk CP, CF, BMa **Red-breasted Merganser:** 1/4 Woodward Hill Rd SJ; 1/25 Norrie Pt CP.

Ruddy Duck: 2/12 HVRT Sharon Stn SL; 1/19 Twin Island Lk BJM; 1/29 Drake Lk BMa.

Conspicuously absent (third year in a row): **Canvasback**. We also missed **Blue-winged Teal** this year.

GALLINACEOUS BIRDS, LOONS, GREBES, and HERONS.

Ring-necked Pheasants were listed on 7 reports, although these are not "countable" as wild birds, since Dutchess is peppered with hunting preserves that regularly replenish their "huntee" population. **Wild Turkeys** have rebounded to their pre-2016 numbers, with 30 records averaging 15 each. Deb Kral found 6 turkeys on Stissing Mountain Rd on the 17th, "high in poplar trees eating buds." **Common Loon,** unusual for March, turned up one at a time in 5 different locations, the earliest reported by Scott Lenhart on the 2nd. We had 3 different **grebes** this year: **Pied-billed** (normal numbers), **Horned** (1/18-19 Sylvan Lk CP, MR, BMa, CF), and one breeding-plumaged **Red-necked Grebe** found by Carena Pooth on the Hudson at Mills Mansion on the 21st. **Great Blue Herons** were seen starting the 3rd, on nests at various heronries around in the second half of the month.

Double-crested Cormorants returned with 4 records, the first being 4/25 Tivoli Bays SR, PS, AMP, BMa, CP.

VULTURES. Black Vultures (20 records, avg 4 each) and Turkey Vultures (84 records, avg 3 each) were seen throughout the month as expected.

One **OSPREY** arrived early this year. Deb Kral found it in the pouring rain at Tamarack (Bontecou) Lake on the 31st.

EAGLES and HAWKS. Bald Eagle numbers were consistent with last year's (69 records avg 3 ea). There were 7 records of Golden Eagle, all in Dover except 1/5 HVRT Sharon Stn DK and 1/24 Mashomack DK. There were 20 records of Northern Harrier, just like last year. Sharp-shinned and Cooper's Hawks were both reported throughout the month, with Cooper's being spotted about twice as often as Sharp-shinned (as usual). Red-shouldered and Red-tailed Hawks were normal, with 27 and 134 reports respectively. Broad-winged and Rough-legged Hawks eluded us this year.

American Coot: 1/20 Drake Lk CF, SJ; 1/25 Drake Lk LM

CRANES. Last year brought in Dutchess County's first two March records of **Sandhill Crane.** This year we had one report from Justin Schmidt, who saw one flying behind a flock of geese near the Rhinebeck library on the 31st. A rare bird with literary aspirations?

SHOREBIRDS. Killdeer, which had arrived in February, were reliably vocal and visible throughout March (31 records, avg 3). Mona Payton entered the earliest report, of two birds on the 4th at Southlands. She said it was "fluffed up and trying to probe the freezing ground." Susan Rogers reported the first-ever March **GREATER YELLOWLEGS** in the county from Tivoli Bays on the 5th. One **Wilson's Snipe** was found by John Askildsen at the CIES Lowlands on the 28th. **American Woodcock** was reported early in the month after arriving in February, but it is likely this species was adversely affected by the snowstorm and extreme cold that hit on the 14th. Many woodcocks were found dead in Central Park after the storm, victims of starvation because of the deep snow. Dutchess woodcock details for March: 3/1 Recreation Rd Beekman CP; 1/1 Red Wing Beekman CP; 1/2 Ludlow Woods Rd DK; 1/16

Daley Rd LaGrange, flushed from recently plowed gravel driveway, 18-24" of snow fell 2 days ago CP; 1/24 Verbank yd, heard peenting BB.

GULLS. Our usual gulls, **Ring-billed**, **Herring**, and **Great Blackbacked**, were as expected. More exciting were two **ICELAND GULLS** found at McEnroe Compost by John Askildsen on the 2nd and a **LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL** found on the Hudson River at Beacon Waterfront Park by Curt McDermott on the 5th, seen also by several members returning home from a club field trip to Croton Point.

OWLS. Plenty of reports – PEEPSters got the word out!

Eastern Screech-Owl: 10 records, avg 1 each. All were reported from the Pine Plains/Stanfordville area except one at Ryder Pond. Both red & gray phase were seen.

Great Horned Owl: 12 records, avg 1 each. Deb Kral reported one on the 21st in her yard, adding, "Nest failure as anticipated with the storm, one of the pair remains in the area and was chased through the woods, across the street and back by a 'murder' of 8 American Crows."

Barred Owl: 6 records, avg 2 each.

KINGFISHER. There were 21 records of **Belted Kingfisher** throughout the month.

WOODPECKERS were well reported as usual: Red-bellied and Downy 106 and 110 records respectively; Yellow-bellied Sapsucker 8 records; Hairy 61 records (higher than usual); Northern Flicker 22 records (still low); Pileated 39 records. Scott Fackenthall reported the only RED-HEADED WOODPECKER, on the 27th on Didell Rd. Unfortunately, Mudder Kill Swamp, where Justin Schmidt found a pair last March that was seen by others for several weeks, did not yield any Red-headed Woodpecker sightings this year.

FALCON reports included 19 records of American Kestrel, 6 of Peregrine Falcon, and 2 of Merlin.

PASSERINES – the largest taxonomic order of birds.

An exciting first March record for Dutchess was a **VESPER SPARROW**, reported on Sheffield Hill Rd on the 5th by Alex Kearney and at the same location by Chet Vincent on the 13th; it was subsequently seen by many club members. Alex initially found the bird on February 12th and took some photos, which are in included in his 2/12/17 eBird checklist (ebird.org/ebird/view/checklist/S34998818).

This year's initial migration push was punctuated by that mid-March snowstorm, which brought snowbound birders much delight at their feeders. We enjoyed large numbers of **American Tree Sparrow** (54 records vs 24 in 2016) and **Fox Sparrows** (59 records vs 19 in 2016), which reminded me of my comment in the March 2007 records report: "Wow! They showed up everywhere with the last snowstorm on the 16th!" Once the roads had been cleared, birders ventured out. We had 18 records of **Horned Lark** averaging 111 each (versus one lonely bird last March!). The go-to sites we visited back in January and February were once again abuzz with larks, and there were 16 records of **Snow Bunting** mixed in, averaging 13 each. Topping that, Barbara Butler checked O'Leary Farm on the 18th and was rewarded with a surprise **LAPLAND LONGSPUR** in breeding plumage!

Red-breasted Nuthatch (15 records vs 0 in 2016) and **Winter Wren** (6 records vs 0 in 2016) were easier to find this year than last. Observers also recorded **Brown Creeper** (6 records). There were 3 sightings of **Golden-crowned Kinglet** but none of **Rubycrowned.**

Alex Caviglia found a very early **Gray Catbird** at Bower Park on the 7th. Also reported were **Hermit Thrush** (2 records) and **Cedar Waxwing** (6 records, avg 11 each). A lone **Chipping Sparrow** spent the month in the welcoming yard of the Michelins in Wappingers. There were 2 records of **White-crowned** and 86 of **White-throated Sparrow**. Susan Rogers found the only **Field Sparrows** (3/30 Mills/Hopeland). There were 2 records of **Savannah Sparrow** and 3 of **Swamp Sparrow**. There were two sightings of **Eastern Meadowlark** (3/13 Sheffield Hill Rd CV; 1/28 Bethel Cross Rd CV). Janet Allison was the only one reporting **Pine Siskin**, with 7 at her feeders on the 7th. **Purple Finches** were few (only 2 records vs 35 last year). There were **NO towhees** of any kind and **NO warblers** this March.

Reflecting the contrast with March 2016's mild weather, many species were back to normal numbers after having surged last year, including **Eastern Phoebe** (24 records vs last year's 72), **Tree Swallow** (21 vs 50), **Eastern Bluebird** (70 vs 125), **American Robin** 98 vs 159), **Northern Mockingbird** (30 vs 51), and **Rusty Blackbird** (5 vs 16).

Finally, many common birds were reported as usual: Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Mallard, Rock Pigeon, Mourning Dove, Blue Jay, American Crow, Fish Crow, Common Raven, Blackcapped Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, White-breasted Nuthatch, Carolina Wren, European Starling, Song Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Northern Cardinal, Red-winged Blackbird, Common Grackle, Brown-headed Cowbird, House Finch, American Goldfinch and House Sparrow.

APRIL 2017 RECORDS

Weather – No April showers this year. Only 5 days had more than a quarter inch of rain, and none more than an inch. Despite the lack of April rainfall, streams and ponds were full of the March blizzard's meltwater. The only nights at or below freezing were 1⁻² and 8-9. For most days the high temperatures were 60s to 80s.

The standing water around the creek in the Cary Lowlands produced some interesting marsh birds. The marsh birds that frequented the wetlands along the Harlem Valley Rail Trail in Amenia have returned. The first big wave of warblers came during the last 3 days of April. There were some late winter finches.

WATERFOWL

The spring waterfowl migration occurs during March through May. The exact range differs for each species. The spring migrants that appeared in April were ---

Blue-winged Teal: 2/22 Separate Rd AMP; 2/27 Buttercup West FT.

Northern Pintail: 1/1 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd JCo. **Green-winged Teal:** Here through the month. Most - 60/20 Buttercup West BMa; 23/10 Round Pd Amenia DK.

* Redhead: 1/21 CIES VM

Ring-necked Duck: Most around the Thompson Pond area thru the 6^{th} . Peak - 150/1 Twin Island Lk MR; Last - 2/23 Ryder Pd DK.

Greater/Lesser Scaup (too far out to get specific ID): 50/1 Rhinecliff MR; 6/1 Mills-Norrie SP--Norrie Pt MR.

MARSH BIRDS

Several uncommon marsh birds found the wet meadows at Cary Lowlands. The standing water has stayed longer than usual, perhaps due to the March blizzard's slowly melting 2 feet of snow. American Bittern, Sora, Virginia Rail were heard by many and seen by a lucky few. The interesting marsh birds at Sharon Station have also returned.

American Bittern: At Cary -- First 1/8 FT; Last 1/11 LD, WLS, DH; At Cruger Island Rd – 1/10, 1/12 SR; At HVRT Sharon Station Rd -- First 1/20 CV, AMP; Most 2/29 BMa; Last 1/30 HVRT Sharon Stn BMa, JA, CV.

* Least Bittern: 2/30 HVRT Sharon Stn BMa, JA. First April record since the 1970s or 1980s.

Great Blue Heron: 6 active heronries around the county.

* **Great Egret**: 1/10 Vanderburgh Cove CP, HT; Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd 1/22 SR, 1/23 DG; Unusual for April before 2015.

Green Heron: First 1/13 Hunns Lake Rd-Goose Chase Pd CV, AMP; Most 2/28 CIES BB. 11 records, avg 1 each.

* **Black-crowned Night-Heron**: 2/13, 2/15 SR; 1/14 SJ. All at Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd.

Virginia Rail: 18 records, avg 2 each. First 1/15 Bontecou Wetland Area FT; First at HVRT Sharon Station 2/19 CP, Most at HVRT 5/30 JA; First at CIES 1/20 BMa, DK, most 3/23 CIES BMa. Some will stay to nest.

Sora: 6 records. At CIES Lowlands heard often and seen by a lucky few. First 1/22 CIES MR, CV, CP, BMa, CP, SL, AP and continuing thru end of month; 1/27 HVRT Sharon Stn BMa. **Common Gallinule**: Returned to Sharon Station Rd at the HVRT. First 1/19 Lower Sharon Stn Rd CP; Most 6/30 HVRT Sharon Stn JA. We expect they will nest as they did last year. **Wilson's Snipe**: First 1/3 CIES BMa; 18/9 CIES at Fowler Rd CV; 18/12 CIES LD, WHS Last report from CIES; Many observers at CIES heard them calling. Also other places -- 6/9 McEnroe Puddle, Amenia CV; 1/12 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SR; Last report - 12/15 Strever Fm MR. 36 records, avg 5 each.

Eastern Phoebe: All over! Most 25/9 Buttercup "Multiples in multiple locations" MR; 5/16 CIES 3 at Fern Glen (pr building a nest near creek weather station) DK; 2/23 vd Rhinebeck pair building nest under eave of barn MP.

Great Crested Flycatcher: On the 29th some showed up in 4 different places. Most 4/29 Buttercup MR.

Eastern Kingbird: First 1/28 CIES BB, DK, CP; Found in 5 places in 3 days.

VIREOS - As usual, Blue-headed and Warbling arrive first and second of the Vireos. The rest usually don't get here until May. but this year a few of each made it by end of April.

MAY 2017 RECORDS

This May was cooler and wetter than normal. Some trees, like maples, were leafed out by mid-month. Even the 4 days of 80s-95 during the third week didn't open all the rest. The walnut trees didn't come out fully until month's end. Frequently visited locations were Peach Hill, Cary IES, and Buttercup. **Notation** - #/day, for example 3/10 means 3 birds were found on May 10th.

WATERFOWL -

Resident ducks and geese were raising young ones all over. Female **Hooded Mergansers** with ducklings were reported from Cary IES on the 2nd by BMa and DK. SJ reported a **Common Merganser** flying into a hole in a sycamore at CIES on the 19th. **Wood Duck** female with 4 downy young found at Berkshire Rd by JA in the 28th. The season's last **Greenwinged Teal** departed on the 2nd. **Common Loon** – 2/2 flyovers at Peach Hill CV; 1/7 Mills SP LM; 1/13-20 at Hunns Lake by DK, MR. **Double-crested Cormorants** were at Tamarack Lk, Bog Hollow Rd Amenia, and Peach Hill. The other 8 records were all on or near the Hudson.

<u>Ruffed Grouse</u>: 1/21 Buttercup East DK (only record). Wild Turkey well reported in groups up to 8.

MARSH BIRDS – Great Blue and Green Herons normal. <u>American Bittern</u>: all 5 records from HVRT Sharon Stn. first 2/1 CV; last 1/21 GB.

Least Bittern: 2/2 HVRT Sharon Stn JAll, CP; 1/29 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd, flying near the roundabout lookout to north bay. PSt.

<u>Great Egret:</u> 1/7 Strever Fm MR (only record). We get a few records in spring, but not every year.

JUNE 2017 RECORDS

Rhinebeck BBS route goes across northern Dutchess from Rhinebeck through Pine Plains. The observer reported the species, but not the counts.

JULY 2017 RECORDS

By July the birds are well into their breeding season with many young fledglings out and about.

Weather – In July we had about 3/4 the normal rainfall. Rain mostly came in thunderstorms with widely varying amounts across the county. It was cooler than usual. There was a hot spell the 3rd week and then an overnight low of 46 on the 30th. When the weather is mentioned with the bird record reports, the source is usually the Cary IES weather station – you've seen it on top of the hill between the Fern Glen and Fowler Road. Their data can be viewed at the CIES website ---- http://www.caryinstitute.org/science-program/research-projects/environmental-monitoring-program

About 3 or 4 years ago beavers built a new dam along the Harlem Valley Rail Trail near the Sharon Station Road (south) crossing. That flooded the land west of the Rail Trail over to Sharon Station Road creating great habitat for marsh birds. Since then we've found families of Common Gallinules each year. Both Bitterns (American and Least) have been heard and sometimes seen. The Virginia Rails that had inhabited the pond on the east side all along, flourished as well. Sometime before July 25th, the new beaver dam went out and the west pond drained, leaving only a few pools. The east pond remains full as its water level is maintained by a beaver dam under the trail at the bridge. The gallinules are still around. We'll see how they and the others fare over the next few years.

The **Birds of the Month** are the 5 juvenile **White Ibises**, adding a new species to the Dutchess County list.

Unfortunately they were at a location where access for birders was not possible. Five were also seen in Orange County July 13-17 and then two on Cape Cod from July 28 to Aug 17, and one near Saratoga August 22, all juveniles. Unknown if the same individuals appeared in more than one place. Like other herons, White Ibis wander after breeding. While most White Ibis are found in Florida and into South America, they have very slowly expanded to the north, to South Carolina in 1922, North Carolina in 1950, and Virginia in 1977. New York is about as far north as they regularly wander with most sightings being juveniles along the coast. While it is normal to see Ibises in flocks, some in the hundreds, sightings in the Northeast are generally of one individual. (Thanks to Stan DeOrsey for the above context about White ibis.)

I have been more selective than usual about the specific birds mentioned in this month's report. There were 131 species reported for July. I have included details of only the more significant ones.

<u>White Ibis</u>: 5 juveniles from the 15th to the 28th, then 2/29, last reported on Aug 1. At a private location in Mid-Dutchess where access was only possible for obtaining documentation. AMP,BB.

Northern Harrier: 1/21 Smithfield Valley Rd MY; 1/23 soaring low over interior cat-tail filled wetland FDRNHS PB. Unusual for July.

Broad-winged Hawk: 10 records, avg 1 each. 2/3-4 Old Post Rd/Rt 9, Staatsburg - one perched, the other called from deep in the woods and the perched bird flew off in that direction DK; 2/16 Milan yard SJ. We usually have only 3 or fewer reports for July.

Virginia Rail: 2/20-1 Smithfield Valley Rd MY; 2/23 Buttercup MR.

Common Gallinule: 1/1 HVRT Sharon Stn SL; 3/2 HVRT Amenia DK; 7/7 HVRT Sharon Stn 3 ad 4 yg, 1 yg chased away by adult DF.

Spotted Sandpiper: 5 records, avg 2 each. FIRST 3/5 Madam Brett Pk FT; LAST Date 26, 2 records.; 3/25 HVRT Sharon Stn MS, MM, LMc, KS; 1/26 Bowdoin Pk CP, CF; 2/26 Strever Fm CP.

Solitary Sandpiper: 2/16 Strever Fm HT, CP; 1/26 Bowdoin Pk CP, CF; 1/27 Burger Hill LW. They don't stick around through July every year – or they coming back early? Least Sandpiper: 3/10 Millbrook School DK; 2/16 Strever Fm HT. Early migrants.

Wilson's Snipe: 1/9 Fish Woods Rd - Took flight from swamp near Taconic State Parkway and Ferris Lane intersection JM; 1/31 Buttercup West LW.

American Woodcock: 1/2 CIES Lowlands - Flushed from road edge west side of north bridge JA; 1/13 CIES Lowlands SL. They don't display in July, but they are still around.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo: 12 records, avg 1 each. 1/4 Dennings Pt AL; 2/5 Madam Brett Pk FT; 2/18 at 2 different locations on Woodlea Rd Salt Pt BMa 1/25 Dennings Pt AL.

Black-billed Cuckoo: 11 records, avg 1 each. 2/25 HVRT Sharon Stn MM, MS, LMc, KS; found 3 times at Buttercup by MR; also at CIES, Bowdoin Pk, and 4 yards. Not reported every year for July.

Great Horned OwI: 1/28 CIES KH; 1/31 Rowe Rd MR. **Barred OwI**: 9 records, avg 1 each. 1/3-24 Kral yd Stanfordville 23rd - hooting and psychotic monkey babbling in my yard! DK; 2/9 Depot Hill CP; 1/4 Dennings Pt Young heard begging AL; 1/12 Dennings Pt fledgling heard and seen SS. No reports of **Eastern Screech OwI**... but they don't make themselves known every July.

Acadian Flycatcher: 6 records. 2/2 Quaker Lake Rd HT, CP; 2/31 Nuclear Lk CP; 4/22 Tamarack Prsv FT; 3/8 Pond Gut FT. Found in all the usual places.

Alder Flycatcher: 1/2 CIES Lowlands JA; 1/4 CIES Lowlands JCo; 1/30 Shunpike (at the beaver dam) SJ. Uncommon here. White-eyed Vireo: 1/2 Buttercup MR; 2/9 Peach Hill CF; 1/16 Buttercup East heard only- in area near red/white trail intersection still DK.

Blue-headed Vireo: 2/8 Pond Gut FT; 3/22 Tamarack Prsv FT.

Bank Swallow: 4/1, 4/22 Red Hook Golf Club MP.

Cliff Swallow: 6/2 Hosner Mtn. Rd CP; 9/3, 2/23 Southlands MP – 3^{rd} 9 nests occupied by cliff swallows. House sparrows

have overrun a tenth nest. 23rd - 6 nests, one overtaken by house sparrows, one occupied by cliff swallows, remaining look empty now.

Brown Creeper: 1/14 Buttercup East LW; 1/21 Amenia, west of Cascade Mtn MY; 1/23 Winnakee Nature Prsv FT. Hard to find in summer.

Winter Wren: 1/2 Quaker Lake Rd CP, HT; 1/8 Pond Gut FT; 4/22 Tamarack Prsv FT.

Marsh Wren: 8/12 Tivoli Bays heard on trail along edge of North Bay FT; 1/23 Buttercup MR; 4/25 HVRT Coleman Stn KS MS.

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher: 22 records, avg 2 each. 3/9 Buttercup 1 fledgling MR; 4/16 Buttercup East family group of 3 DK.

Eastern Bluebird: 80 records, avg 3 each. Most 12/3 Southlands MP; 8 reports of young in and around nest boxes. Kudos to nest box monitors!

Hermit Thrush: 1/23 FDRNHS PB; 2/26 Pawling Nature Rsv FT.

Prothonotary Warbler: 1/14 Buttercup. In thicket behind birdhouses between trail and bridge- long look with binos. JM (only record). (Our records here are in the spring. This is our first breeding season record. Breeding range is mid-west south to Louisiana and the mid-Atlantic coast area. They regularly nest in the Montezuma area upstate.)

Hooded Warbler: 1/20 Butler yd Verbank BB; 1/26 Pawling Nature Rsv FT; 2/31 Buttercup East LW.

AUGUST 2017 RECORDS

Birds of the month were the <u>Stilt Sandpipers</u>. They attracted many birders plus 3 Peregrine Falcons and a Merlin.

Weather – August was cooler than normal, but with a wide range of highs (93 on the 22nd) and lows (43 on the 27th). Only one day was above 90. The last week was cool. Rainfall was less than usual with most falling during the first two weeks. Gary Lovett notes that it's been a productive season for all kinds of nuts, fruit, berries and seeds. Plenty of food for the birds preparing for migration.

SEPTEMBER 2017 RECORDS

September started out with cooler than average daytime temperatures. By mid-month the trend had reversed itself and daytime temps averaged about 11 degrees warmer than normal. This number was partially skewed by some decidedly August-like days in the high eighties and low nineties during the last week of the month.

Nighttime temperatures followed a similar pattern, with quite a few nights early in the month seeing temps in the low forties before bouncing back to a more normal range in the high-50s/low 60s.

September broke the winning streak we've had of average to above-average rainfall over the past 5 months (thus our very lush late-summer/early-fall vegetation) by coming in at 1.75", only half the expected amount of precipitation for this month.

NOTABLES: Mona Payton hit the jackpot with her long-legged waders sightings this month. In her backyard no less, Mona reported two **Black-crowned Night-Herons** on the 17th and later, on the 22nd, a **Snowy Egret** at an unspecified location in New Hamburg. Also notable were the four **Northern Roughwinged Swallows** seen at Dennings Point by Neill Cade and the two **Cliff Swallows that** Mark DeDea reported from Greig Farm. Another good find was two **Grasshopper Sparrows** reported by Susan Rogers mid-month in an unmowed field at Greig Farm in Red Hook, an historical but very occasional location for this extremely scarce species.

OCTOBER 2017 RECORDS

Request to eBirders: PLEASE USE HOTSPOTS. When you enter your sightings, before using a personal location of your own, please check for an established eBird hotspot that works.

41 observers reported a combined total of 130 wild species. Last October, 145 species were reported.

BEST BIRDS this month were Red-breasted Merganser, Bonaparte's Gull, Red-headed Woodpecker, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher, and Gray-cheeked Thrush.

WEATHER. We had almost 4 inches of rain, but half of it fell on the $8^{th}/9^{th}$ and the rest on the 29^{th} . Temperatures ranged from 30 to 80, dipping below freezing on only one night.

FINCH FORECAST PREDICTS THEY'LL STAY UP NORTH

This year's Winter Finch Forecast by Ron Pittaway of Ontario Field Ornithologists notes abundant cone crops up north. That's good news for the birds but Dutchess birders are not likely to see many of those northern breeders this winter. There were **only 3 Purple Finch** reports in October, and **NO Red-breasted Nuthatches or Pine Siskins** were seen.

WATERFOWL. Migration is underway, although there were no scoters or Buffleheads yet (just like last year). Common year-round geese and ducks dabbled about in good numbers: Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Wood Duck, and Mallard.

Large waterfowl included some interesting ones: **Greater White-fronted Goose:** 1/3 Ryder Pd DK; 1/6 Ryder Pd AL; 1/7 Ryder Pd JM.

Snow Goose: There were 7 records of 1 each at 5 locations. Brant: 1/15 Casperkill Golf Club JG; 2/28 Thompson Pd AMP Cackling Goose: 1/22 Round Pd Amenia CP

Among the migrating ducks were good numbers of **American Black Duck** (39 records, avg 13 each), **Green-winged Teal** (18 records, avg 8 each), and **Ring-necked Duck** (18 records, avg 8 each). **Ruddy Ducks** showed up in small groups until mid-month, and then built up into big flocks, especially at Sylvan Lake and Round Pond (max 98/27 Sylvan Lk CP). Other migrants: **Blue-winged Teal:** 1/12 Tivoli Bays South Bay SR; 1/15 The Fly HT, CP

Northern Shoveler: 2/26 Buttercup West WC, MS, MN. Gadwall: 1-2/15-26 at The Fly, seen by 11 people. Northern Pintail: 1-16/7-26 mostly The Fly, also Strever Pond, Traver Pond.

Lesser Scaup: 3/17 Round Pd, found by CP and SJ, also seen by DK. They stayed there into November. Hooded Merganser: 1/17 Round Pd Amenia DK, CP; 3/26 Buttercup West WC, MS, MN

The most unusual duck seenwas a **Red-breasted Merganser** on Sylvan Lake, found by Deb Kral on the 16^{th} (see photo) This was the first October record of this species in since 2012.

Conspicuously absent was American Wigeon.

GALLINACEOUS BIRDS. Wild Turkey was the only wild species observed. There were 11 records, averaging 7 each. The largest group had only 14 birds. They know how to hide.

LOONS, GREBES, CORMORANTS, HERONS. A Common Loon spent 3 weeks on Drake Lake. It was seen by 6 different people on 8 different days. Deb Kral reported 2 additional **Common Loon** sightings at Sylvan Lake and on Clove Road, both on the 16th. This is an unusual species for October (most recently October records in 2016, 2015, and 2002).

Pied-billed Grebes were plentiful, appearing in 24 records, avg 1 each. **Double-Crested Cormorants** were reported throughout the month, as were **Great Blue Herons. Great Egrets** appeared in 12 records averaging 3 each.

The BIG SURPRISE in this cohort was a **Snowy Egret**. Mona Payton saw two of them from the train at New Hamburg the evening of October 5th. The only other October Snowy Egret sighting since 1990 occurred in 1999.

The flip side: there were NO Green Herons reported.

VULTURES, OSPREY. Black and Turkey Vultures were as expected – 17 records of Black and 98 records of Turkey Vulture. Osprey reports were normal with 6 records averaging 1 each.

HAWKS, EAGLES. There were only 6 records of Northern Harrier, quite a drop from 18-24 the last 3 years. Sharp-shinned and Cooper's Hawks (our common accipiters) were seen in normal numbers, as were Bald Eagle and our common buteos, Red-shouldered and Red-tailed Hawks. Conspicuously absent was Broad-winged Hawk, which is seen almost every October.

GALLINULES, COOTS. Common Gallinule has been breeding in the Sharon Station Road area since 2014. One of this species was spotted on the 5th by Claudius Feger, on Round Pond. **American Coots** are returning from the north; there were 7 records averaging 3 each.

SHOREBIRDS. This was a good October for shorebirds. Although we didn't have any superstars like last year's Red Phalarope, we enjoyed 8 shorebird species, including the usual ubiquitous **Killdeer** (29 records, avg 3 each). Other shorebirds still passing through included:

Least Sandpiper: Strever Fm: 1/5 CF, CP; 3/10 CV; 1/14 MR Pectoral Sandpiper: 13 records, avg 2 each, mostly at Strever Fm. Also at Thompson Pd: 5/14 JH,DS; 1/20, 7/26 CV Semipalmated Sandpiper: 1/7 Strever Fm MR Wilson's Snipe: 1/10 Strever CV; 1/14 Thompson Pd DS, JH Solitary Sandpiper: 3/2 Thompson Pd SR Greater Yellowlegs: 21 records, avg 4 each. Lesser Yellowlegs: 20 records, avg 3 each.

GULLS. Ring-billed and Herring Gulls were reported in normal numbers, and there was one report of Great Black-backed Gull

(1/16 Long Dock BF). The BIG SURPRISE was a trio of **Bonaparte's Gulls**, found by Chet Vincent at Strauss Marsh on the 31st. In spite of Chet's diligent efforts to get the word out, no one else got there in time to see them.

PIGEONS, DOVES, KINGFISHER. Very good numbers.

OWLS. Although **NO Eastern Screech-Owl** was reported, our two big, common owls did not disappoint. The only report of **Great Horned Owl** was from Barbara Butler (1/1 off Kansas Rd, Clinton), but **Barred Owls** chimed in lustily, producing 11 records averaging 1 each from LM, MP, EC, DK, BAM, CP.

SWIFTS, HUMMINGBIRDS. They cleared out in September!

WOODPECKERS. Kudos to Mona Payton and Deb Kral for spotting two different **Red-headed Woodpeckers** (1/1 Payton yd Rhinebeck MP, 1/30 CIES Lowlands DK). The only other October sightings of this species in Dutchess since 1990 occurred in 1990 and 2004. Our more common woodpeckers (**Red-bellied**, **Yellowbellied Sapsucker**, **Downy**, **Hairy**, **Northern Flicker**, and **Pileated**) are doing great.

FALCONS. American Kestrel – 10 records, mostly single individuals. Merlin: This species seems to be on the increase. There were 9 records of 1 each. Peregrine Falcon: Also well reported with 5 records throughout the month of 1 each.

PASSERINES. The remaining birds in this report all belong to the largest order in the taxonomy of birds – *Passeriformes*. This order comprises more than half of all bird species. By contrast, all the birds reported above are distributed among a total of 15 different orders! Passerines are often called "Perching Birds." Their toes are arranged in a way that makes perching easy (three pointing forward and one pointing back).

FLYCATCHERS. Most flycatchers had already headed south by October. There was only one lingering **Eastern Wood-Pewee** reported (1/7 Buttercup MR). **Eastern Phoebes** were still here in good numbers – there were 59 records, averaging 3 each, the latest on the 31st. This is as expected.

VIREOS. Two **Yellow-throated Vireo** reports came in (1/4 Thompson Pond FT; and 1/6 Buttercup East AL). It's time for those guys to have gone south! **Red-eyed Vireos**, seen in October every year, appeared on 7 records averaging 1 each. **Blue-headed Vireo** is a far more common fall migrant but a very beautiful one, always eyeing its surroundings through stylish white spectacles contrasting with its steel blue face. There were 16 records averaging 1 each, the last on the 25th.

CORVIDS, CHICKADEES, TITMICE, NUTHATCHES. Most of these are very common species and they occurred in the usual numbers all over the county. Unlike last year (but just as in 2015), **Red-breasted Nuthatch was not reported.** This may be due to the bountiful cone crop up north. Among the not-so-common corvids, there were 3 records of **Fish Crow**, averaging 1 each. **Common Raven** brought in 38 records. It is also worth noting that there was again a huge number of records of **Blue Jay** (173 vs. 171 last year and 129 in 2015). **American Crow** records numbered 150, averaging 5 each.

SWALLOWS. Stragglers! Tree Swallow: 6 records, averaging 25 each, latest Sharon Stn Rd 25/22 CP, HT & 1/22 CV. Barn Swallow: 2/17 Drake Lk Barb Mansell.

CREEPERS, WRENS. Brown Creeper is always fun to see. There were 4 records averaging 1 each. There were still a few **House Wrens:** 6 reports of 1-2 each, from Stony Kill, Mills, Buttercup, and Vassar Fm. Another wren that needs to head south for the winter is **Marsh Wren,** of which there were two reports: 3/14 Buttercup MR, and 1/19 Stissing Pd JM. **Winter Wrens** breed in a few places in Dutchess, but most of them go further north to nest and pass through here during migration. There were 3 reports: 1/14 Thompson Pond DS, JH; 1/21 Pawling Nature Rsv KH; 1/22 Buttercup West BB. While the other wrens move out, **Carolina Wrens** stay and are now visiting feeders, singing loudly to brighten even the dreariest day. There were 46 records, averaging 1 each, of Carolinas throughout the month.

GNATCATCHER, KINGLETS. Blue-gray Gnatcatchers normally leave by mid-September, but Brendan Fogarty found one on the 16th at Long Dock Park in Beacon. This highly unusual sighting is the only October record for Dutchess since 2002. Turning to our far more common fall treetop foragers, **Ruby-crowned Kinglets** pass through the area each year in good numbers. There were 49 records of 1-12 each. **Golden-crowned Kinglets** migrate through here as well, but some can be found in Dutchess throughout the winter. There were 21 records of 1-7 Golden-crowned Kinglets, the first being 1/1 Willow Glen Rd JM.

THRUSHES AND MIMICS. This group is a mixed bag. Most are largely absent in winter, including **Gray-cheeked**, **Swainson's**, **Hermit, and Wood Thrush; Gray Catbird;** and **Brown Thrasher**. We were lucky (just as we were last year) and had the two least common birds on that list, **Gray-cheeked Thrush** (1/26 Buttercup West WC) and **Swainson's Thrush** (1/11 Montgomery Place FT; 1/18 Tymor Pk FT). There were 9 records of **Hermit Thrush**, averaging 2 each. No one reported **Wood Thrush** or **Brown Thrasher**, so those must have left in September (as they should!). **Gray Catbirds** were reported through the 26th, which is normal.

Ohers in the Thrushes & Mimics group can be found throughout the winter: **Eastern Bluebird, American Robin,** and **Northern Mockingbird.** Bluebirds and robins flock together as they search for and consume ripe berries on bushes and trees. There were 84 records of **American Robin**, averaging 9 each (the biggest flock had 100 birds). **Eastern Bluebird** was on 75 records of 1 to 23 each. There were 25 records of **Northern Mockingbird**, 1 to 3 in each. **STARLINGS, PIPITS, WAXWINGS.** There were 80 records, of **European Starling**. Barb Mansell found 17 **American Pipits** at O'Leary Farm on Salt Point Turnpike on the 17th. They were seen there again on the 19th and 21st, and 75 were seen there on the 22nd by Carena Pooth and Herb Thompson. There were 40 records of **Cedar Waxwing**, 1-75 each.

WARBLERS. We must bid most of these beloved gems farewell for the winter. The ones we see in October are mostly wearing their drabber "confusing fall" plumage. Still, we love to see them (and most of us enjoy the ID challenge!).

Common Yellowthroat: 11 records, 1st through 22nd. American Redstart: 1/1 Stanford Wildlife Prsv DK; 1/4 CIES BH; 1/5 Buttercup East JAll. Northern Parula: 1/1 Buttercup MR; 1/4 Ludlow Woods Rd DK; 2/5 Buttercup East JAll. Magnolia Warbler: 5 records in 5 locations, 1 each. Blackpoll Warbler: 4 records 1st thru 16th. Black-throated Blue Warbler: 1/1 Ludlow Woods Rd DK Palm Warbler: 22, 1-12 each, through the 31st. Pine Warbler: 1/1 yd Wapp Eileen Stickle. Yellow-rumped Warbler: 59 records of 1-20 each. Black-throated Green Warbler: 4 records, avg 6 each.

SPARROWS. The least common sparrows seen in October were **Vesper Sparrow** (1/2 Stony Kill MK; 1/21 App Trl Pawling KH) and **Lincoln's Sparrow** (8 records from MR, CP, DK, SR, KH, HT). **American Tree Sparrow** was reported only once, by Eileen Stickle in her yard on the1st. There were 38 records of **Chipping Sparrow** through the 26, the highest being 40 on 2 records. **Field Sparrow** occurred on 17 records through the 31st. **Dark-eyed Juncos** started showing up on the 7th, and the highest count was 20/7 Stony Kill KH. Our other backyard winter sparrow, **White-throated Sparrow**, was everywhere all month (78 records). There were 7 records of **White-crowned Sparrow**. **Song** (97 records), **Swamp** (13 records) and **Savannah** (15 records) were as expected. **Eastern Towhee** numbers were normal too, with 20 records. One disappointment: There were **NO Fox Sparrows** reported.

TANAGERS, GROSBEAKS, ALLIES. There were NO Scarlet Tanagers, NO Rose-breasted Grosbeaks, and NO Indigo Buntings! But Northern Cardinals were red & normal!

ICTERIDS/BLACKBIRDS. The largest flocks of Red-winged Blackbirds had a modest 200 birds each, while Matthew Rymkiewicz reported a bigger flock of Brown-headed Cowbirds (300/22 Mill Rd). Common Grackles, on 14 records, topped out at only 75/18 Tymor Pk CV.

Moving on to a species that is more likely to pique your interest, **Rusty Blackbird** was reported on only 3 records: 3/5 Ryder Pd CF; 24/15 Sharon Stn Rd, North East TS; 2/25 Allen Rd Salt Pt BMa

FINCHES. There were 56 records of **House Finch** (normal) but only 3 records of **Purple Finch** (way lower than normal – keep in mind that Winter Finch Forecast mentioned at the beginning of this report). **American Goldfinches** were plentiful as usual, appearing on 71 records averaging 11 each.

The much reviled **House Sparrow** frolicked in usual numbers.

NOVEMBER 2017 RECORDS

Temperatures were an unusual 74 degrees on the 2nd & 70 degrees on the 3rd with 40's to 60's for the rest of the month. We had frost with the low temperatures by the end of the month. Some notable finds this month were: Greater White-fronted Goose, Long-tailed Duck, Snowy Egret, American Woodcock and 3 Flycatchers. Some permanent species were omitted from this report.

Waterfowl: Mute Swans, Mallards and Black Ducks were found on most lakes & ponds in good numbers. Canada Geese - most: 4210/5 Tamarack Lk FT and were seen on most lakes and ponds in smaller numbers. Wood Ducks still reported in small numbers with most: 25/11 Wapp Lk ,FT. Migrants were slow to move south with open waters in the northern part of New York again this year.

DECEMBER 2017 RECORDS

There were 2800 records for 105 species in December, most through eBird. Highlights of the Sharon CBC and Ulster/Dutchess CBC were added. (The part of the Sharon CBC in Dutchess is mostly in the Town of Northeast. The Dutchess part of the Ulster/Dutchess CBC is in the Towns of Red Hook and Rhinebeck.) The full results of the Dutchess Christmas Bird Count held on the 16th were reported separately in the January Wings.

Weather was fairly warm until the 5.5 inch snow on the 9th. then mostly around freezing or below (except for the 19th in the 50s). Besides a few half-inchers, the only other snow was 2 inches on Christmas Day.

We had a new addition to our Dutchess County list! - a King Eider at Norrie Point. Fortunately the observer was there with his camera when the bird flew in a loop past Norrie and kept going. Unfortunately no one else was able to see the bird. Following this report is the King Eider entry for the next update of the online Birds of Dutchess County.

Several species that are normally gone by December lingered, including our first December record for White-eyed Vireo. Only the highlights for December species are included here. Records for the rest are part of the club archives. They are accessible on eBird. You don't need an eBird userid to look at the data. Just go to eBird.org, select "Explore", then "Explore a Region". Type in "Dutchess", which brings you to a page about Dutchess County. Have fun exploring from there.

Cackling Goose: 1/2 Strauss Marsh CV; 1/17 Northeast Sharon CBC.

It passed the island, then uturned to make a close pass of the pier and joined up with four common mergansers heading north towards the cabin area. Reddish brown coloring, normal sized head, slightly curved bill. silhouette, eye and bill features lead me to believe this to be a female adult king eider."

south to New Jersey. First year birds tend to winter the farthest south. A true sea duck, most of their life is spent at sea. They are also found in arctic Europe and Asia.
