JANUARY 2018 RECORDS

We had an 8-inch snowfall on the 4th and it was very cold until a warm spell 10th-13th. Another snowfall of 7 inches came on the 16th-17th. After the 19th most days had above-freezing high temps. Most ponds and many streams were frozen nearly all month. Sylvan Lake had a small open area. That seemed to be the only open water anywhere judging by the number of species of waterfowl that crowded into that small space. The bird of the month was a **Lesser Black-backed Gull** at the Beacon Waterfront found on the 22nd and last reported on the 27th. This gull's numbers have been increasing south of here and we now have our 10th record with the first found in 2002. The winter specialties, larks and snow buntings, were found in several places. Plus a Lapland Longspur appeared for several days near Pine Plains and one other place. We don't find them

We continue to enjoy the many Bald Eagles through the winter. This year the Golden Eagles were found in their usual haunts in Dover, plus more around Pine Plains and several other locations.

Notation -- The format of an observation is – **#/day location observer**, where **#** is the count of birds seen, **day** is day of the month, **location** is place seen, and **observer** is birder's initials; their full name is in the list of observers at the end of this report.

FEBRUARY 2018 RECORDS

February's weather felt like March. We had about 5 inches of snow that came at about an inch at a time. After mid-month it was quite warm, in the 60s and even upper 70s one day. The woodcocks showed up on the 26th. They usually don't appear until March. Ponds opened up and waterfowl had more places to go beyond Sylvan Lake. The NY62 Bald Eagles seem to have settled on eggs on the 19th... earlier than the average date of the 25th.

Significant sightings – The Lesser Black-backed Gull found in January continued thru the 3rd. More than usual Golden Eagles, Northern Harriers and Merlins were reported. First DC Cormorants for February were seen on the 28th. Most Horned Larks and Snow Buntings were found early in the month.

The Great Backyard Bird Count was the 16th-19th this month.

MARCH 2018 RECORDS

Request to eBirders: PLEASE USE HOTSPOTS. When you enter your sightings, please look for an established eBird hotspot where you birded before using a location name of your own. Identifying and combining duplicate sightings when they are assigned to different names for the same location is a lot of extra work for compilers. Not to mention that we all will benefit if everyone uses hotspots, since we can check hotspot data to figure out where to go birding next!

SUMMARY STATS. There were 4,344 records (after removal of duplicate reports and eBird checklist shares). 103 species were reported (vs 114 last year).

WEATHER. This was the worst March in many years! Last year we complained about a huge snowstorm, but this year the snow and cold just kept on coming! The prevalent analysis is that we had spring in February and Winter in March.

STARS OF THE SHOW: Iceland Gull, Lesser Black-Backed Gull, Brown Thrasher.

CONSPICUOUSLY ABSENT: Ruddy Duck, Canvasback.

WATERFOWL. This winter brought a prolonged period of ice-covered waters. Migration of many species stalled. Good numbers were reported for Wood Duck, American Wigeon, American Black Duck, Green-winged Teal, Ring-necked Duck (several rafts >100), Bufflehead, Hooded Merganser, and Common Merganser. Other birds in the waterfowl category included:

Snow Goose: 14-30 Cruger Island Rd ZN, ESta, JB

Brant: 4/21 Hudson River Pok ESta.

Cackling Goose: 1/9 Hunns Lk AMP.

Northern Shoveler: 3/30 Pine Plains DK..

Gadwall: 7 records, avg 2 each; first sighting on the 3rd. 1-3 seen at Tivoli Bays, Lk. Oniad, and Drake Lk. By SR, BMa, LM, SJ.

Northern Pintail: 7 records, avg 2 each, CP, SR, DK, HT.

Greater Scaup: 7 records avg 1 each, March 3-16, all on Sylvan Lk (with 3 Lesser Scaup the 4^{th} - 16^{th}), CP, AM.

Lesser Scaup: 14 records, avg 2 each, Sylvan Lk, Strauss Marsh, Hunns Lk, and Round Pond from CP, CV, AM, BMa.

Long-tailed Duck: 2/21 Hudson River Pok ESta

Common Goldeneye: 2/10 Cruger Island Rd ESta; 1/24 Tivoli

Bays Cruger Island Rd JP, SR.

GALLINACEOUS BIRDS, LOONS, GREBES, and HERONS. Wild Turkeys were down to 15 records (vs 30 last year), possibly because of the tough winter and deep snow. The largest group contained 21 birds on the 24th (Rhinebeck MP).

There were **no loons** this March, and **the only grebe species was Pied-billed**, with only two records of one each (1/20 Stissing Pd JC; 1/30 Sylvan Lk CP). **Great Blue Herons** were seen starting the 9th, and on nests at various heronries starting on the 11th.

Double-crested Cormorant showed up at the end of the month: 1/31 Stissing Pd JM; 15/31 Waryas Pk KH.

VULTURES. Black Vultures (21 records, avg 2 each) and **Turkey Vultures** (96 records, avg 3 each) were seen throughout the month as expected.

EAGLES and HAWKS. Bald Eagle numbers continue to be strong (71 records avg 2 ea). There were 5 records of **Golden Eagle**, in Dover and Pine Plains, reported by CP, MPa, DF, CV, DK, JCa, AB. There were 17 records (1-6 each) of **Northern Harrier** (20 records last year). **Sharp-shinned Hawk** had only 3 records of 1 each from MR, ZN, SC; **Cooper's Hawk** had 18 records of 1-2 each. In the past, there were usually about twice as many records of Cooper's as Sharpies, so this year's 6:1 ratio is a bit troubling. **Red-shouldered** and **Red-tailed Hawks** were normal, with 21 and 99 reports respectively.

SHOREBIRDS. Killdeer numbers were slightly down, with 13 records averaging 1 each vs 31 records averaging 3 each last year. The first of 10 **American Woodcock** reports in March was 2/3 CIES Fern Glen MR and the highest count was 5/23 Pleasant Valley SC.

GULLS. Our usual gulls, **Ring-billed**, **Herring**, and **Great Black-backed**, were as expected. More exciting was **ICELAND GULL** (1-2/1st and 3rd) Beacon Waterfront Pk CF, ML, CP, MZ) and **LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL** (1/1 Beacon Waterfront Pk CF, CP; 1/31 Waryas Pk KH).

OWLS.

Eastern Screech-Owl: 5 records of 1 each, all from the Pine Plains/Stanfordville area CV. MR. MS. SC.

Great Horned Owl: 5 records, avg 2 each, MR, DK, JAD. Last year there were 12 records.

Barred Owl: 7 records, avg 1 each. JAII, DK, JCo.

KINGFISHER. There were 12 records of **Belted Kingfisher** throughout the month (vs 21 last year).

WOODPECKER. Red-bellied and Downy had 107 and 117 records respectively; **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker** 10 records; **Hairy** 44 records; **Northern Flicker** 41 records (a welcome increase from recent years – last year there were only 22); **Pileated** 42 records.

FALCON reports included 9 records of **American Kestrel** (vs 19 last year) and 4 of **Peregrine Falcon** (CV, MR, BMa, KH). There was also one report of **Merlin:** 1/11 Hunns Lk DK.

PASSERINES – the largest taxonomic order of birds.

There were 18 records of **Eastern Phoebe**, the first being 2/16 Taconic Pkwy Salt Pt DC. In 2017 there were 24 records of this species, while in 2016 there were 72. Phoebes are flycatchers, and there weren't many bugs around this March! Similarly, **Tree Swallow, Eastern Bluebird, Northern Mockingbird, American Robin**, and **Rusty Blackbird** numbers were in the same range as last year, while they had been quite a bit higher after the much milder winter of 2016.

LARKS. We had 7 records of **Horned Lark** averaging 25 each (one of the few benefits of snow) from CP, SR, BMa, MS, CV, DK.

NUTHATCHES, CREEPER, WRENS, KINGLETS. Red-breasted Nuthatch had only one record (vs 15 last year and 0 in 2016): 2/24 Reese Pk KH. Brown Creepers delighted us with 13 records vs 6 last year. Winter Wren had 9 records vs 6 last year and 0 in 2016. There were 23 sightings of Golden-crowned Kinglet (vs only 3 last year!) and 6 of Ruby-crowned Kinglet.

THRUSHES, THRASHER. There were 3 records of **Hermit Thrush** and a very surprising **Brown Thrasher** (2/6 Mills/Hopeland PSt).

WAXWINGS. Cedar Waxwings were reported 13 times with an average of 16 per sighting.

WARBLERS. Yellow-rumped Warbler was back this year after being absent in March 2017. There were 5 records of 1-2 from JP, JAII, KS, CV, AMP, CP.

SPARROWS. There were 39 records of American Tree Sparrow, 3 of Field Sparrow (BB, SI, BMa), and only 6 of Fox Sparrow (mostly during the big snowstorms and way down from last year's 59 records and 2016's 19). We also had 3 records of White-crowned Sparrow (8/9 Bard College Red Hook HP; 1/25 Reagan Rd HT, CP; 1/29 Payton yd Rhinebeck MP), a big 103 of White-throated Sparrow, 3 of Savannah Sparrow (CP, SR, MP) and 5 of Swamp Sparrow (CV, ESta, CP, JCo, SR). Eastern Towhee: 1/10 Dover Stone Church LC, GB; 2/24 Thompson Pd HF.

Eastern Meadowlark: 1/31 N Mabbettsville Rd AMP.

Purple Finches were again few, with 8 records (2 records in 2017 vs 35 in 2016).

Finally, many common birds were reported as usual: Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Mallard, Rock Pigeon, Mourning Dove, Blue Jay, American Crow, Fish Crow, Common Raven, Black-capped Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, White-breasted Nuthatch, Carolina Wren, European Starling, Song Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Northern Cardinal, Red-winged Blackbird, Common Grackle, Brown-headed Cowbird, House Finch, American Goldfinch and House Sparrow.

APRIL 2018 RECORDS

After the series of March snowstorms, April had one more - 3-4 inches on the 2nd. The final snow was another inch on the 6th. There were a few short warm spells in the 70s but the average temperature for the month was 6 degrees lower than normal. The last night to drop below freezing was the 23rd. Some birds were late arriving and a few quite early. The most dramatic indicator of the cold, lingering winter is apparent looking at warbler arrivals. Last year 21 species had arrived by the end of April. This year only 12.

The Hudson River was the source of bird excitement this month. The center of activity was Kingston Point, across the river from Rhinecliff. Bonaparte Gulls, Caspian Terns and others hung around several weeks and occasionally wandered far enough east to be added to the Dutchess list. A Surf Scoter and a flock of Black Scoters were also found on the river. Horned Grebes appeared off Mills-Norrie.

WATERFOWL – Here as expected for April: Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Wood Duck (23 at Strauss Marsh, 20 at Buttercup West), Mallard, American Black Duck, Hooded Merganser (30/2 Drake Lk SC), Common Merganser (37/3 Tivoli South Bay SJ). Many of each species will stay to breed here. Snow Goose: 4 records, avg 1 each. LAST 1/22 Salt Pt Tpk, Stanfordville JAP: BMa notes that one seems to be hanging around with local Canada Geese, seen at various farms along

Cackling Goose: 1/7 Stissing Pd MR. Noticeably smaller than surrounding Canadas.

Blue-winged Teal: 14 records, avg 2 each. FIRST/MAX 6/9 Uphill Fm BMa; 2/10 Salt Pt Tpk/ Uphill Fm DK, SC; DK noted a pair flew out of the marsh and immediately bred, then swam south down the stream. Our most recent records of breeding in the county are from the 1960s. This pair was likely on the way to nesting grounds farther upstate or beyond. LAST 1/29 Strever Fm DK:

Northern Shoveler: 7 records from FIRST 6/7 Sylvan Lk CP. AMP. BMa. MK. SJ to LAST 2/19 Mashomack CV.

Gadwall: 8 rcds, avg 2. FIRST 2/2 Tamarack Lk DK; LAST 2/28 Wapp Lk KH; also 1/7 Sylvan Lk BMa, MK, AMP.

American Wigeon: 1/2 Tamarack Lk DK, SJ; 1/7 Round Pd Amenia CV, CP; 4/14 Tivoli Bays SR, ID, SD.

Northern Pintail: 2/27 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SR. Green-winged Teal: 69 records, avg 9 each. MAX 80/11 Buttercup West SC, Estimate. Could be more. All in back (north) marsh. Several flocks taking off, circling, and landing constantly.

Ring-necked Duck: 58 records, avg 10 each. MAX 39/7 Strauss Marsh CV; 35/15 Lk Oniad AM.

Greater Scaup: 1/18 Mashomack DK; 1/19 Mashomack CV. Lesser Scaup: 6 records, avg 2 each. FIRST 2/4 Sylvan Lk CP; LAST 1/28 Thompson Pd AP; MAX 4/7 Mills-Norrie SP CP; also 2/18 Mashomack CP, CF.

Surf Scoter: 1/10 Hudson mid-channel DH.

Black Scoter: 25/21 Rhinecliff Stn MR (only record).

Chunky and compact all-black ducks flying low headed north past lighthouse, then making their way south.

Long-tailed Duck: 7/7 Sylvan Lk CP, BMa, MK, AMP, SJ; 2/8 Hudson opp Mills DH; X/10 Hudson mid-channel DH.

Common Goldeneye: 3/20 Tivoli South Bay ESta.

Red-breasted Merganser: 7 records, avg 1 each. FIRST 1/18 Tamarack Lk DK: 2/20 DRT swamp N of 55 SI: MAX 3/30 Bontecou Wetland Area, Millbrook, DK.

Ruddy Duck: 4/7 Mills-Norrie SP CP. (None in March.)

GALLINACEOUS BIRDS, LOONS, and GREBES.

Ring-necked Pheasant: 22 records, MAX 12/13 Berkshire Rd TV; all presumed to be released birds.

Wild Turkey: 58 records, avg 4 each. MAX 13/6 Allen Rd Salt

Red-throated Loon: 1/10 Breakneck Ridge South Train Stop CP; 2/19 Beacon Waterfront Pk SJ; 1/21 Rhinecliff Stn MR; 1/29 Dennings Pt JJ; Red-throated Loons are guite uncommon and have not been found in April since 2007. The 10th is a new early arrival date.

Common Loon: 28 records, avg 1 each. 1-4 at Sylvan Lake 4th-19th. First found by CP, then seen my many. LAST 1/30 Hunns Lk DK; Usually found only 1 out of every 2 or 3 Aprils. Pied-billed Grebe: 28 records, avg 1 each. MAX 4/11 Mashomack CP, CF, SJ.

Horned Grebe: We've had increasing counts of Horned Grebes in April since 2013. This April had the most so far. On the 7th CP found 20 at Mill-Norrie SP, then another 5 at Sylvan Lk in transitional to full breeding plumage. The same day BJM found one at Lake Oniad. The Oniad and Sylvan birds were seen through the 8th. On the 11th JR found one at Hunns Lake, which remained through the 18th. Others – 1/19 Beacon Waterfront Pk SJ; 1/29 Twin Island Lk DK, JG.

Double-crested Cormorant: 60 records, avg 6 each. MAX 40/18 Mills-Norrie SP SJ.

BITTERNS and HERONS

American Bittern: 1/13 & 28 Buttercup West JCo; 2/17 HVRT Sharon Stn CV, then 1/23-28 JAII, CP, AM; 1/19 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SR.

Least Bittern: 1/16 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SR. Great Blue Heron: Seen all over. Nesting at Bower Rd heronry 21/13 SC; 7/16 CF About 20 nests, at least 4 occupied; 3/7 Wapp Crk AM, The pair were building a nest in the same tree where the red tailed hawk was occupying a herons nest from last year. (A lone nest, not in a heronry.) ## Great Egret: 1/12 pond near Drake Lake SC, BMa, CP, DK: 2/13 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SJ: 1/19 Beacon Waterfront Pk SJ. Unusual in spring.

Green Heron: Late this year (usually appear early in April). FIRST 1/22 Dennings Pt CP, EIW, SJ; 1/27 CIES Lowlands JAII; then 3 other places on the 28th

VULTURES, EAGLES, and HAWKS - Both Vultures,

Cooper's, Sharp-shinned, and Red-tailed Hawks as usual. Osprey: As nestings have increased in our area, April sightings have increased as well. FIRST 1/5 Rhinecliff PSt; MAX 4/14 Tivoli Bays SR; also 1/22 Dennings Pt CP, EIW, SJ; 1/28 Bannermans Island BB. Plus 7 other places.

Golden Eagle: 1/5 Strever Fm CF.

Northern Harrier: 19 records, avg 1 each. FIRST 2/6 Allen Rd Salt Pt BMa Gray ghosts. Have not seen Harriers for many years on Allen.; Most 2/21 HVRT Sharon Stn CV, AMP male/female; LAST 1/23 Peach Hill CF, CP. [Adult males are called "gray ghosts".]

Bald Eagle: 77 records, avg 2 each. MAX 12/22 Montgomery PI KZS two adults the rest were varying ages...Tivoli Bay low tide feeding...and flying and being attacked by crows. This is a high number of eagles for this time of year. ... We walked the entire grounds.

Red-shouldered Hawk: 32 records, avg 1 each. 2/7 Rowe Rd MR Pair, very vocal in yard; 2/20 Mills Norrie SP AMP male

observed bringing a small rabbit to the female then flying off into the woods.

Broad-winged Hawk: 22 records, avg 1 each. Arrived the 13th at CIES BMa, DK, CF, Peach Hil DW, and DRT KH; MAX 5/14 Tivoli Bays Kidd Ln ID, SD; 3/21 Woodward Hill Rd JM.

MARSH BIRDS -- NO American Coots in either March or April, although some were reported nearby.

Virginia Raii: 6 records, avg 1 each. FIRST 1/2 CIES lowland AMP; 1/14 Tivoli Bays SR Heard and seen on the Cruger Island Causeway past the low tide point on the south side; 1/27 HVRT Amenia CP; LAST 2/30 CIES Lowlands DK.

MAY 2018 RECORDS

[Note the addition of Golden-winged Warbler. The report was a PEEP only and I didn't pick up PEEPs for May.]

May's weather was warmer and drier than normal. We had a microburst/tornado on the 15th. In the SW part of the county some Bald Eagle nests were destroyed and young were injured and rescued. How many smaller unmonitored bird nests were affected no one knows.

Warblers are always the focus of attention for May. It's our best opportunity to see the migrants that go through to nest farther north. When they come back through as "confusing fall warblers" they are harder to ID.

The Yellow-breasted Chat returned to Hopeland again this spring. (Chat is no longer deemed to be a warbler. Look for the Chat report following the sparrows.)

Jane Rossman found a Snowy Egret in a small pond on Sharon Station Road near the HVRT. Most of us drove by the pond without checking it. Folks who then went to look for the Snowy also made other interesting finds.

Hot spots for warblers were Peach Hill and Buttercup. For shorebirds, Strever Farm Road pond.

WATERFOWL – Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Wood Duck, Mallards, American Black Ducks, Hooded Mergansers and Common Loon as usual.

JUNE 2018 RECORDS

June was mostly dry, then a 2-inch rain on the 28th brought the month's rainfall up to near normal. Temps were near normal with two 2-day spells of 90+.

A few north-bound migrants lingered into June, but most had passed through. June is for nesting!

A second county nest site for Osprey was reported

Last May Diane DesAutels reported to Hudson River Almanac a gynandromorphic (genetically part male and part female) Rose-breasted Grosbeak. This year it returned in June.

The Yellow-breasted Chats continued at Hopeland for most of June. (Chat is no longer deemed to be a warbler. Look for the Chat report following the sparrows.)

WATERFOWL - Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Wood Duck, Mallard, Hooded and Common Merganser busy raising young. No American Black Duck reports, which are not found every year in June.

Blue-winged Teal: After reports from several places in May, one lingered at Round Pond in Amenia - 1/3 DK: 1/8 JR Common Loon: 1/2 Wapp Crk AM, JCo (only record).

UPLAND GAME AND WADING BIRDS -- Normal reports for Wild Turkey, Double-crested Cormorant, Great Blue Heron, and Green Heron.

Ruffed Grouse: 1/10 Hudson River, Hyde Pk DH (only record).

American Bittern: 1/19 Tivoli Bays SR (only record). Least Bittern: 2/10 Tivoli Bays SR (only record).

JULY 2018 RECORDS

July's rainfall pattern was unusual. We had several spells of short, torrential showers that added up to 6.35 inches – 1.7 inches more than usual for the month. Temperatures averaged a bit higher than normal.

Among the eBird records this month were checklists that covered long distances. They yielded larger counts of some birds than we find in on our usual outings. There were 4 checklists from an Appalachian Trail hiker, Matthew Daw, who passed through on the 17th and 18th. One checklist covered an 18-mile section. Ken Harris also covered a section of the Appalachian Trail of about 8 miles from Nuclear Lake to the boardwalk at Rt 22. Tom Lake kept track of birds observed on the water chestnut along the Hudson shore during an 8-mile train ride from Poughkeepsie to New Hamburg. Reported in Hudson River Almanac.

There were some early shorebird fall arrivals, notably Semipalmated Plover and Semipalmated Sandpiper plus both Yellowlegs. Again many of our shorebird reports were from Strever Farm pond.

An unusual report was a Common Nighthawk heard in early July. Late spring migrant or early fall? They formerly nested on Pougkeepsie city rooftops about 50 years ago.

AUGUST 2018 RECORDS

While there were no real surprises in store for us, slow and steady might be a good way to describe this month's birding. The rainy weather during the first half of the month kept water levels up, and variety and numbers of shorebird species down. Lush summer vegetation showed no signs of typical August wilt or "die-back", so birds were tougher to see, especially marsh birds. Migrating birds will have plenty to eat, though.

After mid-month when the rains slowed down, if you were looking out your window into some of that lush vegetation bearing fruit (as member Deb Tracy-Kral was), you might have had the same proverbial "bird's eye view" of warblers on the move as she did- proof that nature was still in charge despite what had been looking like a quiet month.

OCTOBER 2018 RECORDS

eBirders: PLEASE USE HOTSPOTS. When you enter your sightings, before using a personal location of your own, please check for an established eBird hotspot that works.

78 observers reported a combined total of 152 wild species (22 more species than in 2017 and 7 more than in 2016).

BEST BIRDS this month were Yellow-crowned Night-Heron, Snowy Owl, Evening Grosbeak, and Clay-colored Sparrow.

WEATHER. Fall colors lacked most reds after a warm September. October temperatures averaged 51, ranging from 26 to 84, and total rainfall was normal at 4.5 inches.

FINCH FORECAST PREDICTS AN INTERESTING WINTER.

This year's Winter Finch Forecast by Ron Pittaway of Ontario Field Ornithologists, noting inadequate cone crops up north, is already being borne out by unusually high numbers of Red-breasted Nuthatches and Purple Finches, plus a scattering of Pine Siskins and Evening Grosbeaks. More to follow!

WATERFOWL. Common year-round geese and ducks dabbled about in good numbers: Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Wood Duck, and Mallard.

We had some interesting geese in October:

Snow Goose: 1/28 Strauss Marsh, blue morph JA. Brant: 21 records, mostly 1-2, plus 24/18 Tivoli Bays SR and a SPECTACULAR riverwatch on the 16th by Sean Carroll and his band of Krieger Elementary School students, netting 1200 Brant passing by Quiet Cove Park over the course of 5 hours! Cackling Goose: Lavalle Rd Pd Amenia: 3-4/23 CP, AM; 2/25 HT,

CP, 1/28 JA.

Ruddy Duck: Sylvan Lake was their favorite spot. 6 arrived there on the 11th and built to 140 by the 30th. Groups of 3 to 22 were seen at other lakes starting on the 14th.

Conspicuously absent was Blue-winged Teal, which had made its first fall appearance in September.

GALLINACEOUS BIRDS. Wild Turkey was the only wild species observed, but more were reported than last year (32 records, avg 9 each). The largest flock had 50 birds, seen at Tamarack (Bontecou) Lake by DK on the 26th

GREBES. Pied-billed Grebe: 11 records, 1-2 each, avg 1.

PIGEONS, DOVES. Very good numbers.

CUCKOOS were seen much later than usual this year.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo: 1/4 West Mountain St Forest AL: 1/5 CIES

Lowlands BCA; 1/26 & 27 Strever Fm CV.

As I write this, I see that a Yellow-billed Cuckoo was just seen in northern Columbia County on November 10th!

Black-billed Cuckoo: 1/22 Dennings Pt SR

SWIFTS - Chimney Swifts also stayed around later than usual. They are normally gone by October, but this year there were 12 records of 1 to 25 (avg 6) between the 1st and 16th.

RAILS AND COOTS.

Virginia Rail is quite unusual for October, but GZ found one on the 29th along the HVRT south of Sharon Station Road. **American** Coots are dribbling in from the north; there were 5 records averaging 3 each, all at Sylvan Lake starting on the 19th. No Common Gallinule was reported this year.

SHOREBIRDS.

Killdeer: 30 records of 1-19 each, avg 5.

Dunlin: 2 were found on the 28th by JK and DV at Strever Pond;

these birds were also seen there by CP, MR, DK. Least Sandpiper: 2/7 Creed Ankony Fm PSt

Pectoral Sandpiper: 11 records of 1-7 each, avg 2, mostly at Strever Fm. This species is usually gone by mid-October, but was

seen through the 28th this year. **Wilson's Snipe:** 1/21 Strever Pd DK; 1/22 Tivoli Bays SR. Spotted Sandpiper: 5 records, 1 each, all at Dennings Point

except one at Strever Fm.

Yellowlegs were way down from last year:

Greater Yellowlegs: 9 records, avg 2, vs. 21 records, avg 4 last

year (about 18 birds this year vs. about 84 last year).

Lesser Yellowlegs: 3 records, avg 2, vs. 20 records, avg 3 last year (about 6 birds this year vs. about 60 last year). One L. Yellowlegs was found dead along the road at Tamarack Lk.

GULLS. Ring-billed and Herring Gulls were reported in normal numbers, and there was one report of Great Black-backed Gull (4/16 Kaal Rock Pk LG).

LOONS, GREBES, CORMORANTS, HERONS.

Common Loon (not so common in Oct): 1/27 Sylvan Lk CP. Double-crested Cormorant: 38 records, 1-42 each, avg 2.

Great Blue Heron: 66 records, 1-12 each, avg 2.

Great Egret: 22 records, 1-18 each, avg 3. 18 were seen at

Dennings Point on the 9th by AL.

Green Heron: 1/6 Dennings Pt DW; 1/14 Bard Campus ESh

The BIG SURPRISE in this cohort was a Yellow-crowned Night-Heron. SL reported one on the river bank at Beacon. There are

only two other October records of this species in Dutchess (in 1997 and 2009)

VULTURES, OSPREY.

30 records (avg 4) of **Black Vulture** and 155 records (avg 3) of **Turkey Vulture** – about twice as many of each as last year. **Osprey:** 1/4 Lower Sharon Stn Rd CV; 1/10 Mashomack CV, DK; 1/17 CIES FT, CV, AMP.

HAWKS, EAGLES.

Golden Eagle: 1/20 Lake Rd Pine Plns DK

Northern Harrier rebounded after a sharp downturn last October. This year there were 24 records, 1-3 each, avg 1. Sharp-shinned and Cooper's Hawks (our common accipiters) were seen in normal numbers, as were Bald Eagle and our common buteos, Red-shouldered and Red-tailed Hawks. Conspicuously absent (like last year) was Broad-winged Hawk, which is seen almost every October.



OWLS. Trick or treat! Halloween brought a super special treat in the form of a very early SNOWY OWL. Big thanks go to Barb Mansell, who spotted it sitting in a horse paddock while she was driving to work, and immediately got the word out via PEEPS. Blissful birders converged on Clinton Corners to catch a glimpse, and the owl stayed into November. This was the earliest fall record for this species photo by Aimee since LaBarr 1923, when a Snowy Owl up in Hyde Park on October

turned 12th.

Eastern Screech-Owl: 1/31 Gray phase, Strever Fm BB, CV. Great Horned Owl: 1/14 Bard EAx; 1/20,24 Tivoli Bays SR. Barred Owl: 8 records, 1-2 each, avg 1.

KINGFISHER. Very good numbers for Belted Kingfisher.

WOODPECKERS. While no **Red-headed Woodpeckers** were reported, there were good numbers of all our other woodpeckers – **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker**, **Red-bellied**, **Downy**, **Hairy**, **Pileated**, and **Northern Flicker**.

FALCONS.

American Kestrel – 25 records, mostly 1 each (vs only 10 records last year!). 3 records were for banded birds at Mashomack and Strever Farm (DK, SJ, LM). DK was able to read one band and found out the bird had been banded at Shawngunk NWR by Zach Smith only 4 months before. Were the 3 banded birds actually a single individual?

Merlin: 11 records, 1 each (9 records of 1 each last year). **Peregrine Falcon:** 1/4 Sheffield Hill Rd CV; 1/31 Thompson Pd BB, AMP, FT, JClo, CV. Last year there were 5 records.

PASSERINES. The remaining birds in this report all belong to the largest taxonomic order of birds – *Passeriformes*. This order comprises more than half of all bird species. By contrast, all our other birds are distributed among a total of 18 different orders! Passerines are often called "Perching Birds" because their toes are arranged in a way that makes perching easy (three pointing forward and one pointing back).

FLYCATCHERS.

Eastern Wood-Pewee: 2/3 Dennings Pt MCa; 1/3 Mills-Norrie SP MW; 1/26 Strever Fm CV; 1/27 Strever Fm CV.

Eastern Phoebes were still here in good numbers – there were 72 records, averaging 2 each, throughout the month.

VIREOS. The first three were later than usual: **Yellow-throated Vireo:** 1/6 Dennings Pt DW.

Red-eyed Vireo: 1/10 Tivoli Bays Cruger Island Rd SI;

1/12 Stony Kill SI.

Philadelphia Vireo: 1/5 Buttercup West KCF.

Blue-headed Vireo: 20 records avg 1 each through the 26th.

CORVIDS. Fish Crow: 4/4 Lower Sharon Stn Rd CV; 1/25 Dennings Pt AL. Common Raven brought in 42 records. Blue Jay numbers were excellent (258 vs. 173 last year). American Crow records numbered 164, averaging 7 each.

SWALLOWS. **Tree Swallow:** 11 records through the 11th, 1 to 21 each, avg 7. **Barn Swallow:** 1/6 Dennings Pt DW.

CHICKADEES, TITMICE, NUTHATCHES.

Black-capped Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, and White-breasted Nuthatch were abundant. On a very bright note, unlike last year, Red-breasted Nuthatch was well reported, netting 26 records of 1 to 2 each, averaging 1 each.

CREEPERS, WRENS. Brown Creeper is always fun to see. There were 4 records averaging 1 each. There were still a few House Wrens: 14 records of 1-3 each. Another wren that needs to head south for the winter is Marsh Wren, of which there were two records: 2/4 CIES AMP, KCF; 2/14 CIES Lowlands AM. Winter Wrens breed in a few places in Dutchess, but most of them go further north to nest, passing through here during migration. There were 4 reports: 1/22 Dennings Pt SR; 1/24 Dennings Pt FT; 2/24 Nuclear Lk CP; 1/30 CIES KH. While the other wrens move out, Carolina Wrens stay and are now visiting feeders, singing loudly to brighten even the dreariest day. There were 118 records of Carolinas (versus only 42 last year!) throughout the month.

KINGLETS. Many **Golden-crowned Kinglets** migrate through Dutchess, but some can be found here throughout the winter. This year there were 23 records of 1-7 each. **Ruby-crowned Kinglets** also migrate through each year in good numbers – this year there were 63 records of 1-12 each.

THRUSHES AND MIMICS. Most thrushes are largely absent in winter, including Gray-cheeked, Swainson's, Hermit, and Wood Thrush; Gray Catbird; and Brown Thrasher. This year we had no Gray-cheeked Thrush, but **Swainson's Thrush** turned up 3 times (1/4 Nuclear Lk AL; 1/4 West Mountain State Forest AL; 1/17 Reese Sanctuary KH). There were 10 records of **Hermit Thrush**, averaging 1 each. There was one **Wood Thrush** (1/17 Reese Sanctuary KH). **Gray Catbirds** were reported through the 26th, which is normal, and thrashers were gone as expected.

Ohers in the Thrushes & Mimics group are found throughout the winter every year: Eastern Bluebird, American Robin, and Northern Mockingbird. Bluebirds and robins flock together as they search for and consume ripe berries on bushes and trees. In October there were 117 records of American Robin, avg 12 each (the biggest flock had 200 birds). Eastern Bluebird was on 98 records of 1 to 11 each (avg 3). There were 44 records of Northern Mockingbird, 1 to 7 in each (vs. 25 records of 1 to 3 each last year).

STARLINGS, PIPITS, WAXWINGS.

European Starling was abundant as usual.

Purple Finch: 116 records, 1 to 25 each, avg 6.

Although some Purple Finches are seen every year, these huge numbers indicate - without question - an irruption.

Pine Siskin: 19 records, 1 to 17 each, avg 4. This irruptive species is not as unusual by far as Evening Grosbeak, but in most years it is not easy to find.

House Finches and **American Goldfinches** – non-irruptive species – were plentiful as usual.

SPARROWS.

CLAY-COLORED SPARROW! Anthony Macchiarola found and photographed one at Stony Kill on the 7th. This species was also reported there by BMa, AL, and SC. It is in the category of "casual visitant" in Dutchess – a true rarity.

Field Sparrow appeared on 25 records through the 25th. There were 18 records of **White-crowned Sparrow**. **Song** (116 records), **Swamp** (18 records) and **Savannah** (30 records) were as expected. **Eastern Towhee** numbers were normal too, with 19 records. There were 74 records of **Chipping Sparrow** through the 31st, the highest being 75 on the 4th. By November most of them have headed south.

Other migrating sparrows were **Vesper** (8 records from BMa, CP, AM, SR, MK, CV, SJ, KH), and **Lincoln's** (11 records from MK, CP, CV, BMa, SJ, AL, SC, DK).

Moving on to winter birds, **American Tree Sparrow** was reported only once (1/28 Mabbettsville AMP). **Dark-eyed Juncos** started showing up on the 4th, and the highest count was 20. **White-throated Sparrow** was everywhere all month (128 records). Our beloved **Fox Sparrow** was spotted only a few times: 1/17 Stony Kill JM; 1/26 Ludlow Woods Rd DK; 1/26 yd Salt Pt BMa; 1/29 Stanfordville DK.

ICTERIDS/BLACKBIRDS. A surprisingly late **Baltimore Oriole** was reported in Poughkeepsie on the 9th by MC.

The largest flocks of **Red-winged Blackbirds** had 300 birds each, while **Brown-headed Cowbirds** maxed out at 150. **Common Grackles**, on 20 records, topped out at 200.

Rusty Blackbird was reported on 7 records of 1-62 each, averaging 14.

WARBLERS. We must bid most of these beloved gems farewell for the winter. The ones we see in October are mostly wearing their

drabber "confusing fall" plumage. Still, we love to see them (and most of us enjoy the ID challenge!).

NOVEMBER 2018 RECORDS

Temperatures were in the 30's and 40's with snow squalls on the 10th. Our first surprise snow (nor eastern storm) came on the 15th with 8 to 12 inches. By months end be were back to rain and windy weather. Some notable finds this month were: Black Scoter, Long-tailed Duck, American Woodcock, Horned Grebe, a late Broad-winged Hawks and a Snowy Owl continued since Halloween. Some permanent species were omitted from this report.

Waterfowl: Mute Swans, Mallards and Black Ducks were found on most lakes & ponds in good numbers. Canada Geese - most: 2000/18 Round Pd Amenia JA and were seen on most lakes and ponds in smaller numbers. Wood Ducks still reported in small numbers with most: 18/11 Hillside Lk FT. Migrants were slow to move south with open waters in the northern part of New York again this year.

DECEMBER 2018 RECORDS

There were only 2 days of half-inch snowfalls, which melted quickly. December's 4 inches of precipitation topped off 2018 with a total of 66 inches, 19+ inches above normal. The result was no snow cover for nearly all of the month. Ponds, lakes, and streams were open and high.

Several stragglers stayed into December... Green-winged Teal, Gray Catbird, Chipping Sparrow, Eastern Towhee, Baltimore Oriole, and Yellow-rumped Warbler. Our usual winter residents, Golden-crowned Kinglets and Snow Buntings were notably scarce. Evening Grosbeaks and Pine Siskins continued to delight some lucky feeder watchers.

Waterfowl highlights were Surf and White-winged Scoters, Long-tailed Duck, and Horned Grebe, which put in brief appearances.

Some reports from the Christmas Bird Counts (CBC) are included. "Dutchess CBC" is centered at Baird Park. "UD CBC" is the Ulster/Dutchess count, which includes Red Hook and Rhinebeck.
